#### FALL CLASSES & TEACHING

A number of our dancers are asking what are the plans for teaching and classes in the Fall, especially at the Plus, A1, A2 and C1 levels. On July 15, the Steering Committee will be discussing this situation again and attempting to obtain the best solution for the maximum number of dancers in the light of recent developments. WE NEED YOUR INPUT, SO READ ON!

The picture is quite complex: 1) The reasons why people attend square dancing are varied from socializing with friends, to the challenge of learning new moves. 2) Classes have been 90 minutes in length, on Mondays and Thursdays. We've had a permit for Wednesday nights, that has been under-utilized by the club. 3) It has been suggested that longer classes would allow more time for teaching, review and position practice. 4) Space at the 519 is still free and we've traditionally had a professional caller for our Thursday night classes, the cost being covered by initial enrolment from the Basic class, which as subsidized the cost of the caller on that night over the length of a full season.

Other twists have been added: 1) the Board of Education is now starting to charge for the rental of school space at a rate of \$55.00 per night. This would require 14 dancers (at \$4.00 per night) to cover that charge alone. 2) To pay a caller for more than one night a week would incur an ongoing deficit for the club, making it financially impossible. 3) Several dancers have been anxious to learn new moves after having danced at the same level for two years (even though some of them still have occasional difficulties with moves from all positions at their current level of dance). 4) In a recent poll, the graduating Mainstream class members have opted to continue their classes on Thursday nights, suggesting that (for the first time ever) the Basic class be moved to Wednesday night.

A suggested solution could be: 1) Have a professional caller teach the Basic class, in order to give them a thorough groundwork on Wednesday evenings, 2) Utilize the calling of Chris and Drew (club callers) to teach the Plus class on Thursday evenings from 7:00 - 9:30. This class would consist of the graduates from the Mainstream class, as well as the present Plus dancers who would Angel the Plus class. Mixed into this class would be 2 tips of A1 teaching. If there were enough dancers, the time from 9:30 - 10:00 could be used for A1 dance review or teaching. If there were not enough for A1 work, the time could be utilized for further Plus dancing, 3) Use our present club callers (Don and Andy) on Monday at Orde St. Public school to teach an A2 class, with tips for C1 moves mixed in. This class would consist of graduates from the present A1 class as well as the present A2 dancers. If enough C1 pupils wanted it, the first 30 minutes, from 7:00 - 7:30, could be exclusively for C1 dance and review. Otherwise, this time would be utilized for whichever level the first 8 dancers wanted.

#### DANCING AT THE C.N.E.!!

That time of year is fast approaching, so don't forget to mark your calendars for **Sunday**, **August 29!** It will be an afternoon of "modern square dancing" with demonstrations from various clubs in the Toronto and surrounding area --including **Triangle Squares!** We made history last year when we were the first gay club to dance at the C.N.E., and we want to be there, again, this year. The registration forms for the event specified that "only smiling, happy people need apply". I think we fit the bill: we're definitely smiling, and not only are we happy...but, we're also happy and gay!

The level of dance will be Mainstream. The actual time has yet to be determined, but it will definitely be sometime after noon (for those who like their morning beauty rest!). The people participating will receive **free admission** to the C.N.E. grounds! And we're invited to stay for the Jamboree Dance from 7-9 p.m., where all the square dance groups

will dance!
