

I still haven't located a caller yet but am still looking. So, we shall begin using basic class tapes. One US Southwest dance group has been using tapes successfully for 10 years so, if they can do it, so can well However, we will hopefully, periodically, have guest callers every now and again.

Dancing on the Net

More and more of us seem to get hooked onto, and then hooked on, the Internet every month. For those new to the net and not yet into the gay/lesbian square dance network, here are two ways to connect to the information.

First, you can subscribe to the e-mail list of Lesbian/Gay Country and Western Square Dancers. To do this, send an e-mail to:

MAJORDOMO@dmshome.youngstown.oh.us.

Ignore the subject, and in the message, enter the lines:

> subscribe lacwsd end

You will eventually start receiving all the messages posted to the address:

lgcwsd@dmshome.youngstown.oh.us.

Be careful of posting messages to this they are automatically address, as forwarded to everyone on the list.

Another source of information is the IAGSDC™ "Web server". The Web is the short name for a World Wide network of information which can be accessed by various programs. My system, for instance, uses lynx; another common one is mosaic. The sequence of screens when using lynx is as follows:

The lynx command gives a list of links that connect to thousands of sites. ElNet Galaxy is one which can be searched by topic. Among the topics is Lifestyle, which is where we often end up. Clicking on Lifestyle give a number of gay resources, including the IAGSDC™.

For those who use a Uniform Resource Locator (URL), that of the IAGSDC™ is: http://hawg.stanford.edu/~sgreen/IAGSDC/. The sgreen refers to Sheldon Green of Times Squares in New York, who maintains this server.

GOOD DANCE HABITS

- Keep your head raised. Do not look at the floor. In addition to giving you a good appearance, it also lets you see what is going on in the entire set, and this will result in fewer breakdowns. Also, stand erect - do not slouch.
- Take hands immediately after every call.
 This allows everyone in the square to be aware of the formation, and aids in proper execution of the next call, thereby averting a possible breakdown of the set.
- Eliminate rough dancing. Such techniques as hip-bumping, jumping, extra swinging and twirling, kicking, etc. are seen as great fun by some dancers. They tend to do these actions when other dancers are not doing them, often disrupting the timing of the dancers who wish to dance smoothly. Rule: All eight dancers should work together as a group, using the same styling as the majority of the square.
- Dance in time to the music. some people, concerned about doing a figure correctly, have a tendency to rush through the steps. If you do your part of a call too quickly, others may not see their position, and cause your set to break down. It is better to relax and move to the beat of the music. Rule: Dance 2-4 beats behind the caller.
- Counterdance. This means moving your body so the transition from one call to another is made smoothly. It also means adjusting slightly to allow others room to do a call. (Example: head move forward and back when the sides are told to Promenade Halfway.) Think of flowing smoothly through the calls.

DEMO TEAM

Though it tends to be a well kept secret, Triangle Squares does have a group that practices on a regular basis, and develops new and strange choreography. The demo team is available for public performances, as a means of promoting the club, and square dancing in general. Look for them to perform again at a fund-raiser for the Hoe Down at the 519 on the 18th of February.
