The last classes in December, prior to the Christmas Break, will be during the week of December 10, 2006. Classes for all levels will resume during the week of January 7, 2007.



In mid-October, I attended Times Square's fly-in, after having won the registration at our fly-in this past spring! Times Square decided this year to try a different location and came up with the historic town of Asbury Park, on the northern shores of New Jersey, a little over an hour from NYC.

The dancing was held at a Grand-Dame hotel of the 1920's, the Berkeley Carteret Oceanfront Hotel. Most dancers stayed at the hotel as well, as few live in town or nearby, which made getting to the richly adorned ballrooms much more convenient.

It'd been many years since I'd attended a square dance event hosted by TS, and I'm very glad I took advantage of this opportunity, as I got to reminisce with old acquaintances, as well as to make new friends. Curiously, Asbury Park and its neighboring town of Ocean Grove, have a growing lesbian and gay population, and I think much of the regentrification is as a result of their influx and influence. These towns are very lovely and quaint, with a predominantly Victorian sensibility to the more ornate architecture. In contrast, there are many decrepit historic buildings, though there's a move to restore these, in time, and with so much development taking place, this will hopefully translate to the restoration of the old Casino complex and the Paramount theatre. I also took advantage to rediscover New York City for a few days, visiting several museums, and wandering around as much as my legs would carry me! Thank-you Times Square for a delightful and well orchestrated fly-in, in a quirky and pleasant setting at the seaside!
