The evening kicked off with a lovely buffet meal consisting of Caesar salad, an assortment of homemade chillies, a variety of breads and refreshments. It was great seeing the staff, children and some of their parents dressed up in their western outfits along with our members in their club shirts.

Soon it was time for everyone to wear off their dinner dancing. Triangle Squares did a demo tip to get everyone in the square dance spirit. Don St. Jean then encouraged the children, parents and staff to join us in an "Intro to Square Dancing" session. At first, it was a bit of a challenge with the varying age groups (children from 6 years to 14 years old as well as adults). But Don quickly had everyone following his instructions and enjoying themselves square dancing to the upbeat music. Midway through the hour-long intro session, Triangle Squares members did another demo mainstream tip.

The children really got excited when we introduced them to the styling for YMCA and when Don asked them "And what do they say?" as we danced to the music of the Matador song. Everyone shouted "Ole!". Don gave everyone a real workout as some children and parents were seen huffing and puffing at the end of the session with a big smile on their faces.

The next day, the children were still hopping and jumping around and talking about what a great time they had at the hoedown. As a result, the gym teacher let them practice their "allemande left", "do sa do", "two ladies chain" and "promenade" moves during their gym class. The children were surprised how much fun square dancing was as well as being a real workout.

Lalitha Flach, the event co-ordinator, could not say enough to thank Triangle Squares on behalf of the students and staff of Hawthorne II Bilingual Alternative School. Without our participation, the event would not have been such a huge success. Lalitha said the staff and parents were quite impressed with how well our members interacted with the different age groups. And we definitely made a lasting impression on the children.

Triangle Squares hopes we were successful in recruiting some new dancers for our upcoming fall classes as we distributed club promotional information to the parents in attendance. The children were even asking their parents if they could take square dancing lessons. Who knows, maybe the future of square dancing lies in teaching the youth square dancing and hooking them on this great past time while they are young!

Come support the Triangle Squares as we perform a demonstration square on the Community Stage at the Paul Kane Parkette on Wellesley Street!


We dance on Saturday, June 24th, from 1:50 p.m. to 2:10 p.m., and from 4:15 p.m. to 4:35 p.m.
